Read a little at a time, perhaps a few verses or maybe even a chapter each day. Do not get bogged down if some of it does not make sense yet. Just keep on reading.

As you read and study the Scriptures, God promises that if anyone truly desires to understand the truth of His Word, He will reveal it to him. Note the promise in John 7:17.
